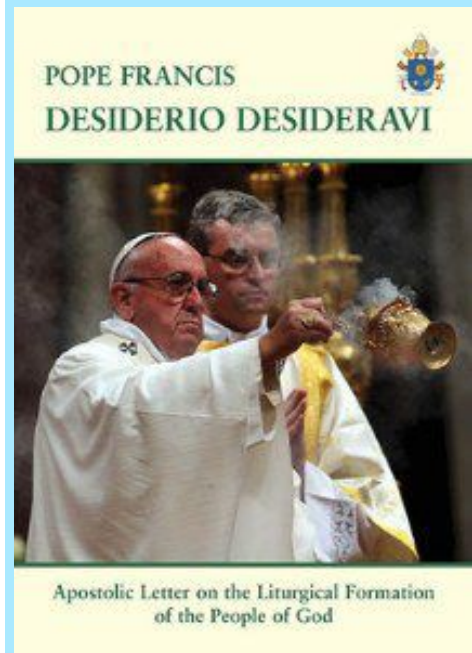

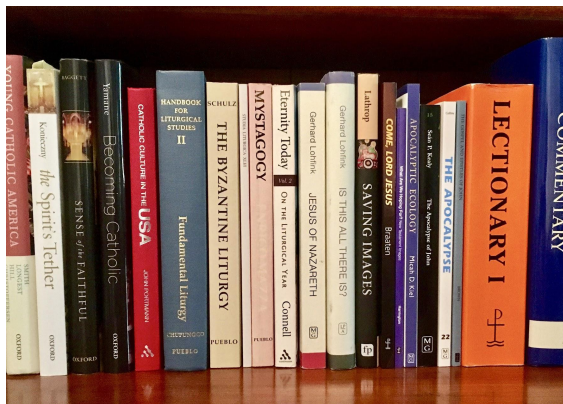

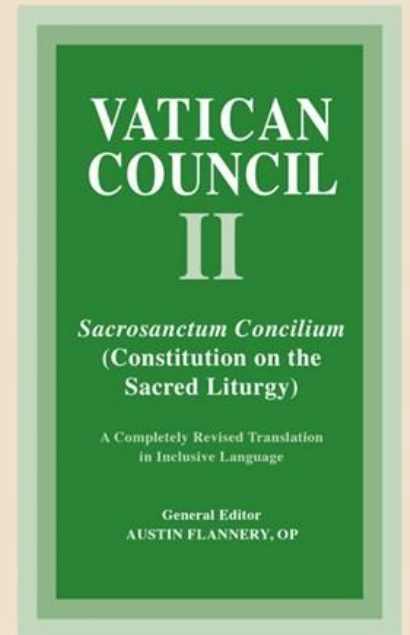

The aim to be considered before all else...

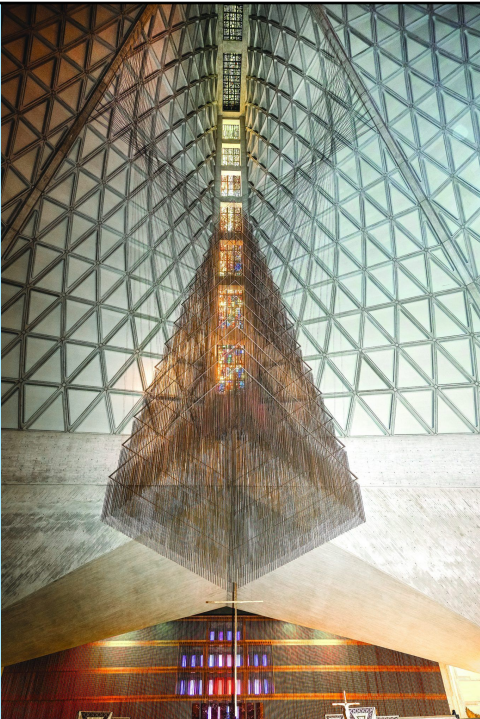
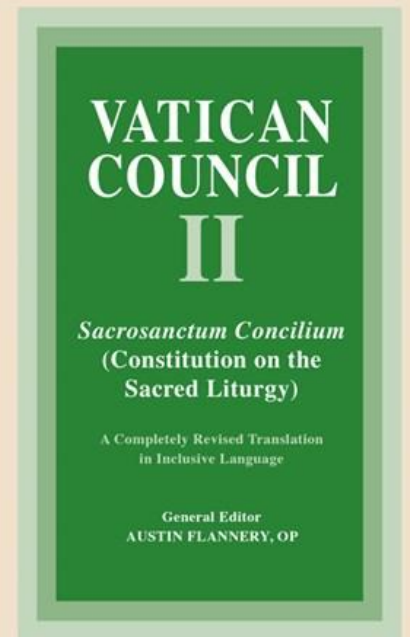
...is the **full, conscious active participation** of all the faithful.

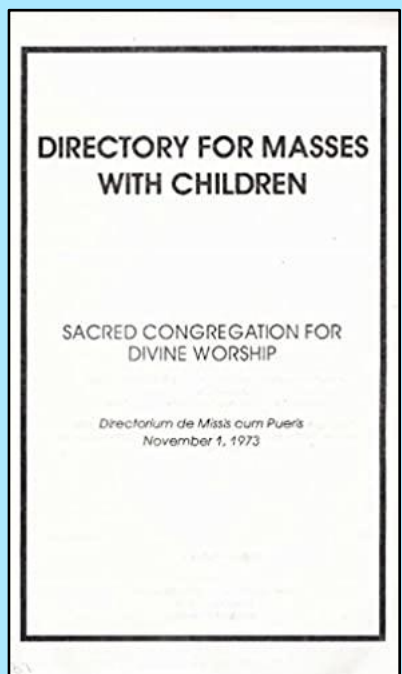


Liturgical Principles

Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship, and its predecessor, Music in Catholic Worship, convey the priorities of musical moments in the Liturgy. The priority list can be understood as follows:

- a) Acclamations**
- b) Processional Chants**
- c) Responsorial Psalm**
- d) Litanies**
- e) Responses**
- f) Hymns and Songs**

The Kyrie (Lord, have mercy) invocations follow, unless they have just occurred in a formula of the Penitential Act




